Background & Context

- National eHealth Library Steering Group set up April 2025 Prof. Helen Whelton (Chair) to implement Chad Report recommendation.
- Steering Group objective is 2 fold:
 1. Business plan (Aoife chairing)
 2. Roadmap (Louise chairing)
- The objective of the National eHealth Library is to provide a central website for free and equal open access to a range of online library resources for all healthcare professionals working in the Irish health system, both public and private providers.

Why a national eHealth Library for Ireland?

Demand for key resources persists

Gaps to key resources remain

Deliver value for money

Enhance patient care and safety through evidence based practice

Remove barriers of access, provide greater equity

Support patient health literacy

2. National e-Health Library Survey

- To support the business case, a survey was developed to identify the current demand for such resources, what gaps exist, the impact of those gaps and if national access provides a viable solution.
- The group disseminated a Smart Survey via email to a wide range of healthcare professional groups both inside and outside of the HSE, through their professional network contacts.
- The survey was open between 05/12/2025 and 05/02/2026 and there was a total of 813 completed responses.
- The survey is currently being analysed, but following are some preliminary findings...





Survey preliminary results

The survey identified those employed directly and indirectly by the HSE.

Directly employed categories were:

Of 813 total responses, the top 3 respondents per job category were:

1. Health and Social Care Professionals
2. Medical and Dental
3. Nursing and Midwifery

The survey asked healthcare professionals why they require routine access to online Library resources, respondents were provided with 9 options and could tick as many boxes as were relevant. The top 3 reasons were;

4. Personal or professional development
5. Teaching, presentations or publication
6. Audit or research



Survey preliminary results (continued)

- To understand the preferences and priorities for online library resources, respondents were asked to rank their preferences from a defined list of resources in order from 1-6, with number 1 being the most preferred. The top 3 preferred resources were:
 1. CINAHL Complete
 2. BMJ Best Practice
 3. UpToDate
- The same above 3 were also identified as the top resources which were regularly or frequently used.
- Of note, 45% of all respondents were ***not aware*** if their employer / organisation / professional body or union subscribe to any online library resources. Awareness of what resources were being subscribed to were predictably higher among those directly employed by the HSE.
