

BACKGROUND




- Both early-career librarians with less than 3 years experience
- Different starting points
 - Emily's first job post-Master's
 - Bryn's second job post-Master's
- Different concentrations during Master's program
 - Neither had Systematic Reviews training during their program

ENVIRONMENT



- Eskind Biomedical Library at Vanderbilt University in Nashville, TN (R1 research institute)
- Affiliated with the larger Vanderbilt University (VU) and the Vanderbilt University Medical Center (VUMC)
 - Includes hospitals, outpatient medical centers, centers, institutes
 - Only Level 1 Trauma Center in Tennessee
- The University covers School of Medicine and School of Nursing
- 10 person team with 6 full-time librarians
 - Review services offered to VU and VUMC
- Larger VU library system with 8 libraries

OBSERVE




- **Sitting in on other team members' Systematic Review consults**
 - Listen to sequence of questions for reference interview
- Ask questions
- Take notes
- Watch team members create search strings for complex topics
- Read over search documentation

Observe



ACQUIRE



- Formal Systematic Review specialization through the Medical Library Association (MLA)
 - Systematic Review Service Specialization Level 1
 - 13 hours of webinars on specialized Reviews topics
- Included webinars, courses, CEs, and database certifications
- Formal certification issued by the MLA upon completion



PRACTICE




- Peer mentoring with other team members
- Practice searches
 - Individualized feedback from mentor
- Begin independent consults
 - Mentor sits in to provide guidance and help answer questions
- Translation practice for other databases
- Proofreading for old searches
- Evidence Synthesis practice

Perform



PERFORM



- Independent consults
 - Added to Review service
 - Meet with research teams for solo projects
- Builds and executes searches
 - Peer review from mentors according to PRESS guidelines
- Continuing education on Systematic Reviews
 - Certifications, courses, webinars, seminars, literature

TAKEAWAYS

Both librarians felt more confident and prepared with the Systematic Review process after completing this scaffolded approach.

Clear benchmarks provide direction and purpose during the learning process.

Benefits include low stress for new librarians, high support from mentors, opportunity for peer connection, and longitudinal learning.

CONCLUSION



- ✓ This process built autonomy in learning and created highly confident, independent librarians.
- ✓ Scaffolded Systematic Review training is essential to preparing librarians to be active partners in the research lifecycle.
- ✓ Formalizing this approach could benefit future librarians in similar working environments.
